

Grampians Region



Population

- The population of Grampians Region has grown more slowly than the state population over the past 10 years, however growth over the next 10 years is projected to be similar to the state rate.
- Grampians has a lower percentage of population in the 15 to 44 years age group than Victoria.

Diversity

- The percentage of people born in a non-English speaking country is the lowest in the state.
- The percentage of humanitarian new settler arrivals is the lowest in the state.

Disadvantage and social engagement

- The rate of people who spoke with more than 5 people the previous day is the highest in the state as are the rates of people who help as volunteer, who feel valued by society and who are members of a religious group.
- The percentage of people who delayed medical consultation due to being unable to afford it is the highest in the state.
- The percentage of people with food insecurity is the lowest in the state.

Housing, transport and education


- The rate of households with rental stress is second highest of all regions; however, the rate of rental housing that is affordable is much higher, at 68.7% compared to the state measure of 19.1%.
- The percentage of journeys to work which are by car is the highest in the state.
- The percentages of year 9 students attaining national minimum literacy and numeracy standards are second lowest of all regions.

Health status and service utilisation

- The percentage of people at increased risk of alcohol-related harm on a single occasion of drinking is the highest in the state.
- The percentages of people reporting heart disease, being obese and poor dental health are the highest in the state.
- The rate of intentional injuries treated in hospital per 1,000 population is the highest in the state.
- The rate of avoidable deaths among people aged less than 75 from all causes is the highest in the state.
- The percentage of people aged over 75 years who live alone is the highest in the state.
- The average length of stay for public hospital inpatients is the highest in the state.
- The rate of general practice clinics per 1,000 population is the highest in the state.

Child and family characteristics and service utilisation

- The percentage of children fully immunised between 24 and 27 months is the highest in the state.
- The rates of child protection investigations completed, child protection substantiations and Child FIRST assessments are all higher than the state measures.






